

Spacing of cable tray supports and hangers of various specifications



Article Overview

Cable tray hangers should be spaced according to cable type, tray material, load, and installation environment, typically ranging from 1.2 to 3 meters for standard runs, with closer spacing for heavy or sensitive cables.

General Guidelines

- Standard horizontal runs: For typical power and control cables, hangers are generally spaced every 1.2 to 1.5 meters for ladder or solid-bottom trays, depending on the cable weight and tray type .
- Heavy-duty or high-load trays: For trays carrying large bundles or heavy cables, spacing may need to be reduced to 1 meter or less to prevent sagging and mechanical strain .
- Vertical risers: Hangers or support rods should be installed at every 1.2 to 1.5 meters, ensuring stability and preventing lateral movement .
- Mesh or wire trays: Rung spacing is typically 150-230 mm (6-9 inches) to support instrumentation and control cables while maintaining proper airflow .
- Parallel tray installations: When two trays are installed side by side at the same height, maintain a minimum distance of 0.6 meters between them to allow access, ventilation, and maintenance .
