

Standard Labeling for Control Switches in Distribution Boxes

Control switches in distribution boxes should be labeled clearly, permanently, and according to recognized standards such as NFPA 70, DIN EN 81346, and VDE 0660 to ensure safety, maintenance efficiency, and regulatory compliance.

Key Principles of Labeling

Unique Identification: Each switch, breaker, or control device should have a unique identifier to avoid confusion and facilitate maintenance, inventory tracking, and operational safety. This can be a number, code, or combination of letters and numbers, following a consistent scheme for the entire panel or facility (LLNL standard) . **Durability and Legibility:** Labels must be abrasion-, UV-, and chemical-resistant to remain legible over time, even in industrial environments. Thermal transfer printing or high-quality label makers are recommended for permanent markings . **Standard Compliance:**

- DIN EN 81346 and DIN EN 60445 provide structured labeling for industrial switch cabinets, ensuring consistent identification of components, wires, and devices .
- VDE 0660 specifies labeling for low-voltage switchgear and controlgear, including switch positions and circuit identification .
- NFPA 70 (NEC) requires clear identification of circuits and equipment for safety and operational purposes .
- UK Wiring Regulations (Section 514) emphasize clear, professional labeling for quick circuit isolation and safety compliance .
