

# Standard Requirements for Concealing Wall-Mounted Electrical Distribution Boxes



## Article Overview

Wall-mounted electrical distribution boxes must remain accessible, properly enclosed, and installed according to height, clearance, and safety standards to comply with NEC, IEC, and BS 7671 codes.

### Accessibility and Concealment

Distribution boxes or junction boxes cannot be permanently concealed behind drywall, plaster, tile, or insulation. NEC Section 314.29 requires that all boxes be readily accessible, meaning they must be reachable by simply removing a cover plate or access panel without dismantling the building structure. Concealing a box creates a fire hazard and prevents maintenance or troubleshooting, which is a common code violation. The cover plate should be the only barrier to the wiring inside, ensuring safe inspection and repair if connections loosen over time or arcing occurs .

### Installation Height and Location

- Residential installations: Recommended height is 1 to 1.8 meters (3.3 to 5.9 feet) from the floor, with 1.3 meters suggested for elderly or handicapped users .
- Wall-mounted boxes: Typically installed 4.5 to 5.5 feet high for convenient access without bending or stretching .
- Outdoor boxes: Should be mounted at least 3 feet above ground and in areas prot...
