

Switch stacking fiber optic connections



Article Overview

Switch stacking over fiber allows multiple switches to operate as a single logical unit, improving management, scalability, and redundancy.

Overview of Switch Stacking

Switch stacking is a technology that enables multiple physical switches to be connected and managed as one logical device. This simplifies configuration, monitoring, and troubleshooting, as all switches in the stack share a single management interface. Stacking also provides redundancy, where a standby switch can take over if the active switch fails, and supports fast failover in case of link or hardware issues .

Fiber Optic Connections for Stacking

To stack switches over fiber, you typically use SFP (Small Form-factor Pluggable) or SFP+ transceivers inserted into dedicated fiber ports on the switches. These transceivers require duplex fiber optic cables (two strands) for separate send and receive signals. For short runs (under 1000 feet), multimode fiber is recommended, while single-mode fiber is preferred for longer distances . Pre-terminated fiber cables with LC connectors are commonly used to save installation time and ensure high-quality connections .

What is Stacking?

A stack port is a port on the switch that is used to communicate with other switches in the stack. Depending on the model, a switch can have either preconfigured or user-defined stack ports.
