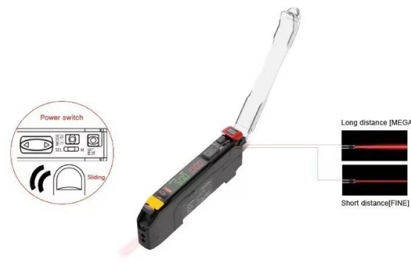


The materials required for power optical cables include

Power optical cables are composed of ultra-pure silica fibers, protective polymer coatings, strength members, and durable outer jackets to ensure high-speed, reliable, and environmentally resistant data transmission.

Core and Cladding

The optical fiber is the central component responsible for transmitting light signals. It consists of a core and cladding, both typically made from ultra-pure silica glass (SiO_2). The core may be doped with elements like germanium to control the refractive index, while the cladding has a slightly lower refractive index to maintain total internal reflection, ensuring efficient light propagation. Plastic cores are occasionally used for short-range or consumer applications.

Coating and Protection

To protect the delicate fibers, a dual-layer UV-cured acrylate coating is applied. The primary coating is soft to absorb mechanical stress, while the secondary coating is harder for additional protection. Aramid yarn (Kevlar) is often used as a strength member to provide tensile strength and prevent fiber breakage during installation or under tension. In some designs, fiberglass rods or other reinforcing materials are added to enhance rigidity and prevent bending.
