Overview

For low-voltage applications, a specialized mounting ring is installed in the drywall, providing a finished opening for the cable to exit. When routing cables along the floor perimeter, baseboard channeling or decorative molding covers are an effective alternative to. NEC Article 392 explains cable trays, their components, appropriate wiring methods for cable trays, and instances where they are and are not permitted for use.
