Cable trays, especially metallic ones, can serve as an Equipment Grounding Conductor (EGC), but they must be properly bonded to ensure electrical continuity and safety . When using copper wires:

- **Bonding to Cable Tray Sections:** If a separate EGC is installed in or on the cable tray, it should be bonded to each or alternate tray sections using grounding clamps. This ensures both electrical continuity and mechanical stability under fault conditions .
- **Avoid Bare Copper in Aluminum Trays:** Placing a bare copper wire in an aluminum tray can cause electrolytic corrosion, particularly in moist environments. To prevent this, use insulated copper conductors and remove insulation only at bonding points, using tin or zinc-plated connectors .
- **Mechanical Connections:** Cable trays are connected using splice plates, bolted connections, clamps, or quick-connect systems. These connections provide structural stability and ensure that the copper bonding wires maintain a secure electrical path .
