

What are the electrical and optical ports on a switch

Electrical ports transmit data over copper cables using RJ45 connectors, while optical ports transmit data over fiber optics using optical modules.

Electrical Ports

Electrical ports, also known as copper ports, use RJ45 connectors to transmit electrical signals over twisted-pair Ethernet cables. They are commonly found in speeds of 10M, 100M, 1G, and 10G, with higher speeds requiring Cat6A or higher cables for reliable transmission . The maximum effective distance for electrical ports is typically 100 meters. These ports are widely used for connecting end devices like computers, printers, and access switches in local area networks (LANs) and are straightforward to deploy since they do not require additional modules .

Optical Ports

Optical ports, also called fiber ports, transmit data as light pulses through fiber optic cables. They require optical modules (e.g., SFP, SFP+, QSFP) to convert electrical signals into optical signals and vice versa . Optical ports support higher speeds, commonly 10G, 25G, 40G, 100G, and can transmit data over much longer distances, up to 100 kilometers, depending on the module and fiber type . Common connector types include LC, SC, MPO, and some optical ports can also accept electrical port modules for copper connections
