

What can corrode optical cables

Optical cables themselves are highly resistant to corrosion, but their protective armor and environmental exposure can be susceptible to chemical and physical degradation.

Fiber Core and Jacket

The core of an optical cable is made of ultra-pure glass or specialized plastic, which does not corrode or chemically react with water or most chemicals . The outer jacket and buffer coatings protect the fiber from environmental damage, but these materials can degrade over time due to UV radiation, extreme temperatures, humidity, and chemical exposure, potentially leading to cracks or loss of protective integrity .

Armor Corrosion

Armored optical cables, often made with low-carbon steel or copolymer-coated metals, are designed to resist mechanical damage and environmental stress. However, if the protective coating is damaged—by rodents, installation cuts, or abrasions—the exposed metal can undergo localized corrosion or pitting, especially in soil with high moisture or corrosive elements . Properly coated armor generally prevents corrosion from spreading under the jacket, and field data show rare instances of corrosion-related failures when the coating remains intact .
