

What color should be used to start fiber optic splicing



Article Overview

Blue, orange, and green fibers are generally easiest to identify and work with during splicing due to their high visibility and standard placement in the TIA-598-C color sequence.

Standard Fiber Color Coding

Fiber optic cables follow the TIA-598-C 12-color standard to ensure consistent identification of individual fibers, which is critical for splicing and maintenance. The standard sequence is: Blue, Orange, Green, Brown, Slate (Gray), White, Red, Black, Yellow, Violet, Rose (Pink), and Aqua (Light Blue). This sequence repeats for cables with more than 12 fibers, often with stripes or markers to distinguish groups .

Choosing Colors for Splicing

- High-contrast colors like blue, orange, and green are easier to see under typical splice tray lighting, reducing eye strain and minimizing errors .
- Yellow fibers are also highly visible but are often used for single-mode fibers, so their use may depend on the cable type .
- Avoid colors that are similar in shade, such as slate (gray) and white, in high-density bundles, as they can be harder to distinguish during splicing .
