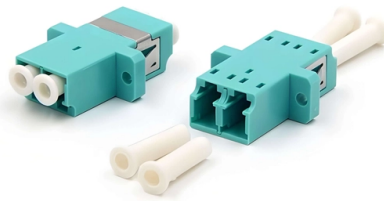


What colors are inside a 6-core optical fiber cable
