Optical modules connect via standardized electrical interfaces to devices and optical fiber connectors to transmit light signals.

Electrical Interface

Optical modules have an electrical interface that connects to the host device, such as a switch, router, or server. This interface can be pluggable (hot-swappable) or embedded, depending on the module type, and is often defined by multi-source agreements (MSAs) like SFP, QSFP, or CXP . The electrical interface carries digital or analog signals to the module's internal driver circuits, which then modulate the optical transmitter (TOSA) for signal conversion . Common electrical standards include the Common Electrical Interface (CEI), which supports high-speed data transmission and ensures interoperability .

Optical Interface

The optical interface connects the module to the outside world via fiber optic cables, either single-mode or multi-mode. This connection is made using fiber optic connectors such as LC, SC, MPO, or MTP, depending on the module form factor and application . The transmitter optical subassembly (TOSA) emits light into the fiber, while the receiver optical subassembly (ROSA) converts incoming light back into electrical signals . The optical interface ensures low-loss, high-speed data transmission over the fiber network....
