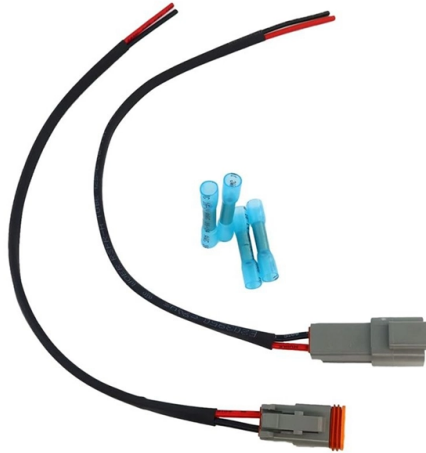

Definition and Function

Structure of Fiber Optic Cables

A typical fiber optic cable consists of several layers:

- Core: The central part of the fiber, made of ultra-pure glass or plastic, through which light travels. The core diameter varies depending on the type of fiber, typically from 5 to 100 microns.
- Cladding: Surrounds the core and has a slightly lower refractive index, which keeps the light confined within the core through total internal reflection
