Key Characteristics

- Single-mode operation: Class B fibers support long-distance, high-bandwidth transmission with minimal signal loss.
- Performance standards: The IEC standard defines tolerances for parameters such as attenuation, dispersion, and geometric characteristics to ensure reliable signal integrity .
- Subcategories: Each fiber category may have subcategories based on transmission attributes, such as low water peak or enhanced bandwidth, allowing selection for specific network requirements .
- Applications: Ideal for telecommunications, data centers, and structured cabling systems where high signal quality is required. They are also compatible with international ITU-T designations for global interoperability
