A patch panel module serves as a central point for terminating and organizing network cables. It allows network administrators to easily connect, disconnect, or reroute devices without altering the permanent cabling infrastructure. Modules can be designed for copper (RJ45) or fiber optic connections, and they often come in keystone or fixed-port formats, enabling individual ports to be replaced if damaged without replacing the entire panel.

- **Copper Modules:** Support Ethernet standards such as Cat5e, Cat6, or Cat6a. They feature RJ45 connectors on the front and color-coded IDC termination blocks on the rear for easy wiring.
- **Fiber Modules:** Designed for optical connections, supporting LC, SC, or ST connectors. These modules are used in high-speed data centers and can handle breakout connectivity from 10G to 400G.
- **Coaxial Modules:** Primarily used in audio/visual installations rather than LAN networks.
