These boxes can be wall-mounted, floor-mounted, or rack-mounted, and typically include removable splice cassettes or trays that facilitate fiber splicing, storage, and organization. They are essential in both FTTH networks, data centers, and long-haul telecom systems, ensuring low signal loss and reliable connectivity .
