- **High-Speed Connectivity:** In multi-fiber systems, such as those using MTP®/MPO connectors, managing polarity is critical to maintain proper Tx/Rx orientation across multiple fibers, especially in high-density and high-speed applications (e.g., 40G, 100G, 400G) .
- **Standards Compliance:** Following established standards (like TIA-568.3-E) for polarity helps avoid installation errors and ensures reliable network performance .
