

What quota should be applied to a 12-core optical cable



Article Overview

For a 12-core optical fiber cable, the recommended quota is typically 12 cores for a communication room and 24 cores for a building room, with adjustments for redundancy and network design.

Recommended Core Allocation

According to the IBDN standard, a 12-core cable is generally allocated as follows:

- Communication Room (per building): 12 cores
- Building Room: 24 cores These are general guidelines and may vary depending on the number of wiring points, switches, and redundancy requirements .

Redundancy Considerations

When designing a network, redundancy is crucial to ensure reliability:

- Stacked Core Switches (dual-machine hot standby): 6 cores may suffice, with 2 cores per switch in use and 2 cores reserved for redundancy.
- Non-stacked Switches: Each switch typically requires 4 cores, plus an additional 4 cores for redundancy. In practice, each terminal may use up to two cores, and some designs may allocate 1-2 cores for line redundancy to optimize cost while maintaining reliability
