DYDGZA is a type of outdoor, armored, stranded loose tube optical fiber cable designed for high-strength and environmental protection applications.

Cable Construction

DYDGZA cables typically feature optical fibers housed in loose tubes, which are made of high-modulus plastic and filled with a tube-filling compound to protect the fibers from moisture and mechanical stress. These tubes are stranded around a central metallic strength member, forming a robust cable core. The core is then armored with laminated aluminum tape to provide protection against physical damage, rodents, and environmental hazards. Finally, a low-smoke zero-halogen (LSZH) outer sheath is extruded to ensure safety in case of fire and to provide additional mechanical protection (similar to GYTZA cables) .

- Temperature Range: Operates reliably between -40°C and +70°C .
- Mechanical Protection: Armored core resists crushing and rodent attacks.
- Environmental Suitability: Designed for outdoor installation, including direct burial or duct deployment.

- Length: Standard lengths are typically around 2,000 meters, with custom lengths available
