

Wiring of cable tray T-junction box in vertical shaft



Article Overview

Proper installation of a cable tray T-junction in a vertical shaft requires careful planning, mechanical support, correct bend management, and safety measures to prevent cable damage or accidents.

Planning and Layout

When installing a T-junction in a vertical shaft, the main vertical cable tray acts as the backbone, with horizontal branches extending to each floor or equipment level . Horizontal runs typically start with a downward bend from the vertical tray, allowing cables to sweep smoothly onto the branch without sharp angles . Ensure that the T-junction is positioned to maintain minimum bend radius for all cables exiting the vertical tray to prevent insulation damage .

Mechanical Support and Fixation

Vertical cable trays must be securely anchored to the shaft walls using brackets, clamps, or cleats that provide constant lateral clamping force . Avoid closed loops of ferromagnetic steel when using metal supports, as this can interfere with electromagnetic compatibility . For T-junctions, ensure that the horizontal branch is supported independently to prevent sagging or stress on the vertical tray.
